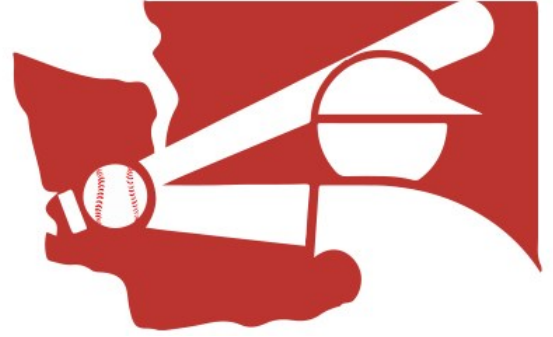

Tim Sanders, Southridge

Tim Sanders is a native of Kennewick, Washington – living there all but his collegiate years. Tim has been married to his high school sweetheart Jill, for 28 years. They are filled with pride by their two children: Emma (26) a teacher/coach, and Ethan (24) an architect.

Tim graduated from Kennewick High School in 1985 where he played ball for WSBCA Hall of Famer Dean Hoff. After high school, he attended Lower Columbia Community College, playing for Steve Farrington. After LCC, Tim played one year at Portland State University for Jack Dunn, and then decided it was time to focus on his teaching career. Tim has been teaching for 30 years, 25 of those years at Southridge High School.

To date, Sanders has a 32-year coaching career. He was an assistant coach at Ellensburg High School, Hanford High School, and Kennewick High School. Then he had the good fortune to land at Southridge High as the first and only head baseball coach in the school's history. A role he's held for 26 years.

Sanders built a program based on perseverance, character, and work ethic – emulated by the stellar coaches and players he learned from along the way. Led by Coach Sanders, the SHS Baseball Program has accumulated 390-185 record in 26 years. Southridge Baseball earned an impressive 8 League Championships, 3 District Championships, 4 Regional Championships, 10 State appearances, 4 Final Four appearances and 2 State Championship Titles (2004 and 2018). Sanders is a 2-time recipient of the WSBCA Coach of the Year and an 8-time recipient of the MCC/Big 9 Coach of the Year.

In addition, Sanders (along with others), developed the Kennewick/Southridge Bandits American Legion program in 1997. This organization has been instrumental to the development of players and the success of SHS Baseball.

Sanders believes he is privileged to have coached with the finest assistant coaches over the years. To name a few: the original and 2004 State Championship staff included (Paul Sanders, Steve Davis, Jeff Jones and Ty Fischer); the 2018 State Championship staff included (Lance Hattemer, Herb Coulter, Erik Stark, Jordan Reeder and Travis Coulter); and the current staff includes (Hattemer, H. Coulter, T. Coulter, Chris Hildman and Ethan Sanders). Sanders recognizes the SHS Baseball program would not be what it is today without the unyielding dedication and tenacity of his staff.

Marco Malich, Peninsula

Marco Malich spent a lifetime as a Peninsula Seahawk. One of the few coaches to have the opportunity as well as distinction of coaching at his alma mater (1959). He was not only a standout athlete but a remarkable coach, friend, and mentor to so many student-athletes as well as fellow coaches.

He played with distinction at Peninsula High School playing four years of baseball, including a .350 batting average and 11 home runs as a senior captain playing pitcher, catcher and outfielder; four years of basketball, including a senior season as captain; and three years of football for the Seahawks.

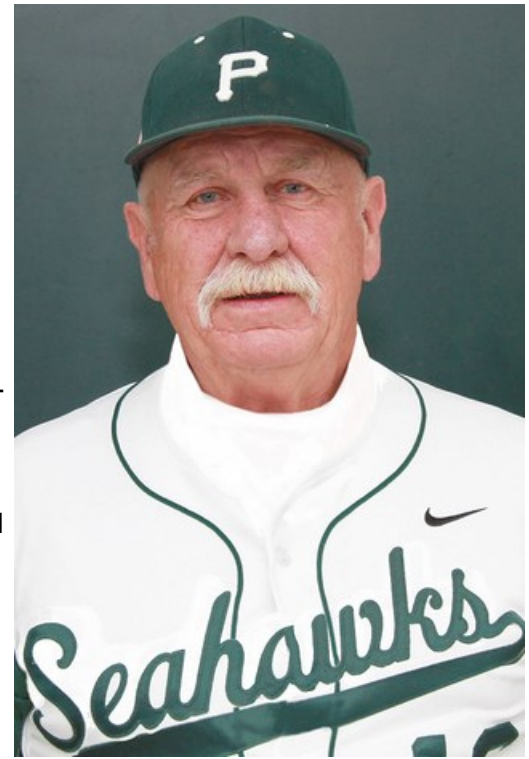
He went on to play semi-pro baseball in Alaska with the Ketchikan All-Stars for 10 years. And batted .450 for the Heidelberg slow-pitch softball team and a fifth-place finish at the 1968 ASA (Amateur Softball Association) nationals at Jones Beach, N.Y.

His opportunity to coach Peninsula came as Gig Harbor High School opened in 1979 and all the Peninsula coaches moved to the Tides. His first team was filled with kids he had coached in middle school. "The second year we won one game," Malich said. The team improved to .500 in his third season and every year after until 2008 they were .500 or better.

Malich went on to coach four years of baseball at Goodman Middle School, 20 years as an assistant football coach at Peninsula High School and a total of 33 years as the Seahawks Head Coach amassing 435 wins, 15 playoff appearances, 15 league championships, 16 regional appearances, and a runner-up finish in 2006 while being named coach of the year. Coach Malich is also a member of the 2013 WIAA Hall of Fame Class.

Before Coach Malich retired from coaching in 2012 he had the opportunity to coach his sons and grandsons and enjoy watching his grandkids participate in athletics before his passing in 2019.

Malich was married to his wife Sandi, a fellow Peninsula grad and his companion of more than 50 years, have four grown children and "tons of grandchildren."



Velko Vitalich, West Seattle

Coach Velko Vitalich spent over 40 years coaching and teaching at his alma-mater (1973), West Seattle High School, following his graduation from Western Washington University in 1978. He was the Head Baseball Coach for 31 years, from 1987-2018. He has been a mainstay in the West Seattle community on and off the athletic fields impacting countless young lives. He compiled an impressive 398-256 win-loss record while leading West Seattle to 5 Metro League titles, 26 playoff appearances including 14 state tournament appearances, and a runner-up finish in the state championships in 2013. He was named regional Coach of the Year in 2012. He also coached West Seattle to an amazing 22-2 season in 2006.

He played baseball and basketball in high school, then basketball in college. After graduating from Western Washington University, he started his teaching career as a substitute teacher and coach at West Seattle and remained there his entire career. He coached the girls-basketball team in 1978 and continued for 26 years. He also coached girls soccer and golf along the way. Velko was also a high school basketball official for over 40 years.

He's immensely proud that "most of my kids have gone to college and played in college." He estimates he has coached more than 750 players

over the years at West Seattle. Many of them "come back around to say hi, or come to fundraisers," or exchange e-mail or social-media messages with him.

Coach Vitalich has been married to his wife Karen for 40 years and has 2 children, Kyle and Maddison, and has 7 grandchildren.



Gregg Swenson **Sehome, TCC, UW, WSU, Portland, Kings' Way**



For over three decades, Gregg Swenson has been a staple in the Pacific Northwest baseball community.

He began his coaching career as the pitching coach at Sehome High School in Bellingham in 1992. As an assistant under hall of fame coach Gary Hatch, Swenson helped the 1992 Sehome club to a second-place finish in the state playoffs while both the 1993 and 1995 teams earned fifth-place finishes.

Swenson coached the 1993 Bellingham Post 7 American Legion team to a second-place finish in the state tournament and also guided the 1994 British Columbia White Rock Tritons to the Washington Palomino Baseball state championship.

Swenson joined the Tacoma Community College staff as the pitching coach in 1996 and became Head Coach in 1997, spending five seasons as the Titans' skipper, leading the Titans to the NWAACC Tournament in three (1997, 2000, 2001) of his five seasons at Tacoma. He was the NWAACC Western Division Coach of the Year in both 1997 and 2000.

From 2002-05, Swenson was an assistant coach at the University of Washington for WSBCA Hall of Fame coach Ken Knutson. The Huskies also reached three-straight NCAA Championships (2002-04) for the first time in school history.

Following his stint in Seattle, Swenson spent 10 seasons (2006-15) as the pitching coach at Washington State University that helped lead Washington State to back-to-back NCAA postseason appearances in 2009 and 2010.

In 2015, Swenson joined the University of Portland coaching staff under head coach Geoff Loomis. He was responsible for the Pilot pitchers as well as the program's academic and community outreach program.

He returned to the prep ranks in 2018 as the head coach at King's Way High School where he guided his squad to a state runner-up finish. That same year, he led the Camas Little League all-stars to a district title and fifth-place finish in the state tournament.

Following his season with King's Way, Swenson began working for AstroTurf as the Northwest Regional Sales Manager, where he was recognized as the company's Rookie of the Year in 2019 and the Salesperson of the Year in 2020. In addition to his position with AstroTurf, Swenson owns 57 Baseball, LLC and started the Coast to Coast Turf Baseball program, an amateur baseball program in the greater Portland/Vancouver area.

Swenson earned a degree in physical education/exercise science and physiology/sports psychology from Western Washington in 1994. In 1997, he completed his master's degree in teaching from City University. Swenson and his wife Diane are the parents of daughter, Megan and son, Jacob.

Jerry Striegel, Tenino and Rochester

Jerry Striegel coached for over 30 years and acted as Head Baseball Coach at Tenino and Rochester High Schools. He skippered Tenino for 12 years after assisting for 3 years and acted as Rochester's Head Baseball Coach for 9 years following his 6 year tenure as an assistant. Throughout his head coaching, he developed programs producing an impressive 4 League Championships, 4 District Championships, 7 Regional appearances, 3 Final Four appearances, a 3rd place finish (Rochester 2014), and Coach Striegel led teams to 2, 1A State Championships; Tenino in 1986 and Rochester in 2008.

Striegel was awarded with the WSBCA Dave Johnson 2A/A/2B/B Coach of the Year Award in 2008 and was inducted into The Centralia College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2014.

Coach Striegel played his high school career at Rochester before moving on to Centralia Community College and Western Washington University.

His career has included 39 years of teaching and 18 years as Rochester's Athletic Director and at varying points has acted as a Head Volleyball Coach-14 years, Head Tennis Coach-1 year, High School Assistant Girls Basketball Coach-7 years, Assistant Volleyball Coach-4 years, Assistant Fastpitch Coach- 3 years, Middle School Basketball- 15 years, Middle School Football- 5 yrs.

Striegel and his wife, Kitty have been married for 44 years and have 2 children, Sara and Scott.
