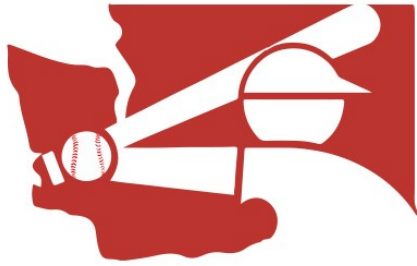

Glen Walker **Liberty, Auburn Mountainview**

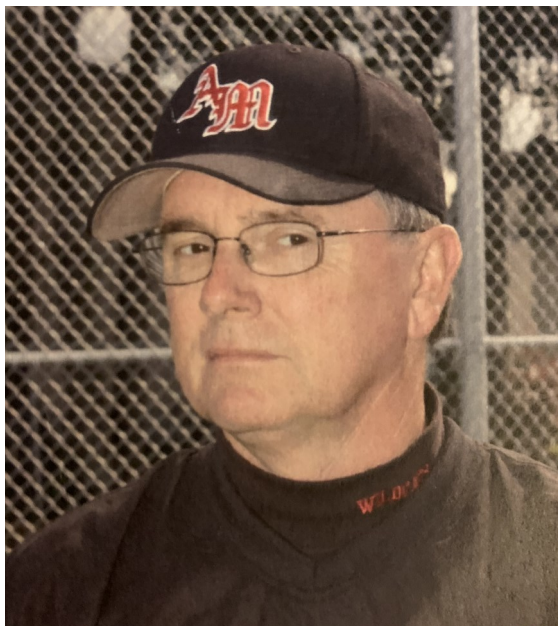
Glen Walker graduated from Liberty High School in Issaquah in 1990 where he played football, basketball, and baseball. He then attended Gonzaga University and played shortstop all 4 years. Glen earned all-league honors 3 of the 4 years while at Gonzaga, graduating in 1995 with a degree in Physical Education and Health.

Coach Walker has taught PE and Health at all levels of public education for the past 26 years, most recently at Auburn Mountainview HS.

Coach Walker has spent all 26 of his seasons coaching in Western Washington, 8 of which were at his alma mater, Liberty HS, and the last 16 at Auburn Mountainview HS. He coached at Liberty from 1998-2005 leading them to the 3A State Championship in 2003 behind the right arm of 2-time Major League Baseball Cy Young Award winner, Tim Lincecum. Walker was named All Region Coach of the Year by The Seattle Post Intelligencer and was runner up for State Coach of the Year. As the Head Coach of Auburn Mountainview, 2005-2021, Coach Walker led the Lions to the 3A State Championship in 2013. That year Coach Walker was named the WSBCA Paton-Fouts Large School Coach of the Year. Overall, Coach Walker's teams appeared in 16 district tournaments, 8 state tournaments, and won 2 State Championships. He has been named League Coach of the Year numerous times.

Coach Walker's teams are typically very prepared for what might occur between the lines, and strive to create havoc for the opposing teams with a philosophy of putting pressure on the opposing coach, pitcher, and defense and working tirelessly on making plays defensively leading to an overall career record of 317-207-1.

Coach Walker has served the WSBCA for over a decade and currently as Vice President. He is a frequent clinician around the Pacific Northwest graciously willing to share his vast knowledge with colleagues and young coaches. He is married to his wife Dena of almost 23 years and has a daughter, Kaylee 16, a sophomore at Auburn Riverside HS and a son, Evan 12, a 6th grader at North Tapps MS.



Ed Gay

Archbishop Murphy, Cascade (Everett)

Ed Gay was born in Everett, Washington in 1950 and resided there until moving to Arlington, Washington in 2015. Ed graduated from Cascade High School (Everett) in 1968 where he played basketball and baseball and also played American Legion Baseball in the summer. After graduating from Cascade, he went to work for Scott Paper Co/ Kimberly Clark for 38 years and retired at 56. Ed also worked for The Boys and Girls Clubs of Snohomish County and the Badges for Baseball program as director in conjunction with the Cal Ripken Sr. Foundation and the Everett Police Department for 9 years that served 200 boys and girls each summer.

Coach Gay's first coaching assignment was as an assistant at Cascade from 1988-1993 under Hall of Fame Coach, Bob Smithson. He then coached as the Head Junior Varsity Coach from 1994-2000. Ed coached both Senior and Junior American Legion in Everett along with Hall of Famer Lou Stevenson where he started the Junior program in 1994 and won the District and State Championship that year. He then moved on to Archbishop Murphy High School from 2002-2005 where he skippered them to their first ever State Championship in 2004 followed by a stint at Everett HS from 2008-2010. He returned to Cascade from 2013-2015 and completed his 22-year career at Jackson HS in 2020. Coach Gay was selected as league Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2005 and State Coach of the Year in 2004.

Ed has been married to his high school sweetheart, Denise, for 53 years. Has 2 sons and 5 grandchildren.

Barry Rodland

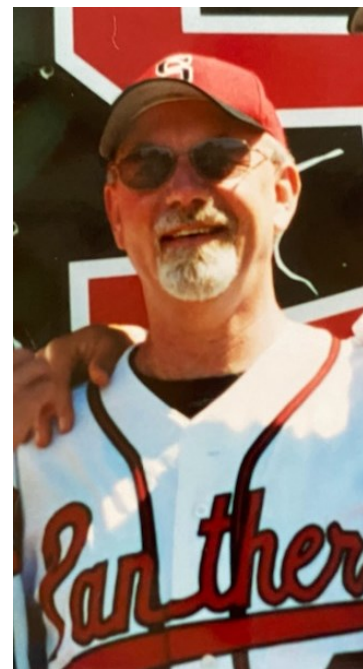
Coupeville, Snohomish

Barry Rodland was born in Everett, Washington in 1950, grew up in Snohomish, graduating from Snohomish High School in 1968. He played baseball on scholarship at Washington State University, graduated in 1972 and earned his Masters Degree from W.S.U. in 1979. He coached football for 40 years, served Snohomish High School as a social studies teacher from 1975-1978 and school counselor from 1978-2015, retiring in 2015.

Coach Rodland began his career volunteering at Snohomish High School and Pullman High School from 1973-1975 and was an assistant at Crook County High School in Pineville, OR from 1977-1978. He was hired at Coupeville High School in 1978 and served as Head Coach from 1978-1980. At Coupeville, Coach Rodland led his teams to 2 district tournaments in 1978 and 1979 and was league and district champion in 1980, earning a birth to the state playoffs that same year. From 1996-2006 he coached at Snohomish High School as an assistant in 1996 and as Co-Head Coach from 1997-2006. During that time, with Hall of Famer Kim Hammons, he led the Panthers to a league championship, 7 district tournaments, 2 district championships, 4 state tournaments, and a State Championship in 1998.

In 1979 and 1980, Coach Rodland was recognized as an Honorary NW Feeder Game coach and coached in the All-State Series in 1999. Along with Coach Hammons, he re-built the Snohomish High School Baseball field using private resources providing the Snohomish baseball community a first-class facility for years to come.

Coach Rodland passed away recently in 2022 and is survived by his wife of 47 years, Cindy, 4 sons, and 12 grandchildren.



Larry Marshall

Charles Wright Academy, Spanaway Lake, Pacific Lutheran University, Emerald Ridge



After graduating from Clover Park High School, Marshall attended Washington State University and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Bobo Brayton, graduating in 1974 and continuing his graduate education in 1975. Marshall started his head coaching and teaching career in 1975 at Charles Wright Academy. As Head Coach from 1976-81 he led the Tarriers to three consecutive second place Nisqually League finishes followed by three consecutive State Championship Games, winning the Class A Championship in 1980 with a 29-0 record and being ranked second Nationally by Easton. The 1979 and 1981 squads won league, district, and regional titles before finishing second at State. It was the 1980 team that broke through with an unbeaten season and State Championship. Marshall was Nisqually League Coach of the Year in '79, '80, '81 and Washington State Coach of the Year in '79 and '80. The Board of Pierce County Commissioners recognized Coach Marshall and the Charles Wright team with the Seal of Pierce County in 1980.

In 1982 Marshall moved to Spanaway Lake H.S. developing a baseball program from scratch and winning the PCL Championship in year 2, falling in the second round of playoffs and was awarded the Pierce County League Coach of the Year award as he led the Sentinels to a 17-4 record.

Marshall was then named the Head Baseball Coach and Assistant Director of Athletics at Pacific Lutheran University in 1983, where he completed 19 seasons and a record of 317-367-1. Receiving 3 Northwest Conference Coach of the Year Awards and 2, District 3 Coach of the Year awards before retiring in 2002.

In 2004, Marshall was inducted as a member of the first Hall of Fame class at Charles Wright Academy and inducted into the Tacoma-Pierce County Baseball-Softball Old-Timers Association Hall of Fame in 2005.

From 2005-2013 Marshall devoted his time with counseling/educating of various teams and individuals throughout the Pacific Northwest and simultaneously served as Head Coach of the Puyallup Knights, one of the premier select teams on the west coast.

In 2013, Marshall accepted the Head Coaching position at Emerald Ridge High School. During 6 years at Emerald Ridge, Marshall's teams recorded a 76-57 record, earning three post-season births and earning one Final 8 State Playoff appearance. Marshall was named Coach of the Year for the South Puget Sound League in 2016.

From 2002-present, Marshall has continued to dedicated his efforts with today's youth in developing character and baseball skills through camps, state conventions, and serving as the Director of Hitting at the Big-League Edge in Kent Washington. Coach Marshall also served the WSBCA for many years and served as its president from 1979-1981.
