

Jay Hultberg, North Mason

Jay Hultberg was born and raised in Centralia, WA and is married to his wife Vickie and has 2 sons and 2 grandsons.



Jay was selected Athlete of the Year at Centralia High School in 1976 as he played football, basketball, and baseball. During Jay's senior year he was selected as All-conference in football and basketball, all-state in baseball as a catcher.

He then moved on to attend Lower Columbia Community College and Linfield College where he lettered twice in baseball at both schools.

Upon graduation from Linfield, Coach Hultberg was assistant baseball coach at Centralia Community College in 1981. In 1982, he was an assistant Slow-Pitch coach at Centralia High School the year that the program started. IN 1982 he moved on to North Mason high school as a history teacher and assistant baseball, basketball, and volleyball coach.

In 1985, he took over the reigns as the head baseball coach until his retirement in 2010. Coach Hultberg's overall record was a milestone of 300 wins going 324-221 during his tenure. The Bulldogs accrued 8 league and divisions championships, 4 district championships, and 67 state tournament bids with 2 quarterfinal finishes and 1 semi-final finish. Coach Hultberg's teams were always know for their solid fundament play and tenacity and competitiveness in their approach to the game.

Tim Gilmore, Centralia

Tim Gilmore was born in Tacoma, Washington and has lived his entire life in Washington state. Tim has been married to his wife Jerrilynn for 46 years and has made his home and has worked in Centralia that entire time. The Gilmores have 2 children and 5 grandchildren. Coach Gilmore has spent his entire life dedicated to the Centralia community in so many ways that they are difficult to number.



Tim has coached at Centralia High School for 46 years. He has coached football (12 yrs.), basketball (32 yrs.), volleyball (25yrs), baseball (32 yrs.), and advised the Badminton Club for 30 years. As the baseball head coach from 1979-1986, he led the Tigers to multiple state tournaments. Finishing in the final four 3 times, the regional finals 3 times, and winning the state championship in 1982. As an assistant baseball coach, he coached the 1993 team to a state championship and the 1994 team to a final four appearance and he was awarded the Dan White Assistant Coach Recognition in 2006. Tim also was awarded as the Basketball Assistant Coach of the Year Award in 2012.

Coach Gilmore has made such an impact on the Centralia Community that upon his retirement in 2012, the students renamed the Centralia High School Commons, "The Gilmore Commons". And his influence on student-athletes was so wide-spread that the school created the "GIL" Award that is given annually to the student-athlete that exemplifies "Guidance, Inspiration, and Leadership". Tim takes great pride in not only being a coach, but a leader in the Centralia and wider community as well. He has officiated 27 weddings of former students and officiated 10 celebrations of life of Centralia students. In addition, he has spent the last 11 years conducting overseas missions in developing communities.

Coach Gilmore's lifetime of selfless dedication and commitment to community and young people is immeasurable and his legacy will influence countless people from Centralia to the Hall of Fame to the world.





Hired as the head baseball coach at Tahoma High School in 1993, Coach Hayden has amassed a record of 378- 204- 4, making the district tournament 19 times, state regionals (sweet 16) 10 times, and the final four 4 times where he has taken three 3rd place finishes and one 4th place finish. His teams have also won 7 league championships, 7 district championships, and 4 regional championships.

He has had an amazing amount of talented players over the years and was even able to coach, along with his older son Clay, a special group of young men to a 3rd place finish at state in 2003. Many of his players have gone on to play college ball and a few even on to play in the minor leagues. More importantly, most of his players have become successful in their lives and many of them are giving back to the great game of baseball by becoming coaches themselves.

Russ is currently blessed with some great assistant coaches, Gail Meier, 24 years (unfortunately, this is Gail's last season as he is moving out of state). Heath Brester - 16 years, Duane Henkel and Kevin Hurt - 10 years each, Brandon Oliver - 5 years and Chris Sexton - 3 years, Phil Tarli – 8 years, Mike Seger – 7 years, and Clay Hayden – 5 years have all made a lasting impact on the program and players. Of these coaches, Brester, Oliver, Sexton, Seger, and Hayden were all former players at Tahoma.

After 36 years of teaching and coaching at Tahoma, Russ plans to retire from both following the 2019 school year. He feels blessed to have all those great players, and assistant coaches throughout his 26 years. However, he knows that he couldn't have done this all these years without the love and support of his family, especially his wife, Erin.

Pete Jansen, Gig Harbor

Pete Jansen was born in Chicago, Illinois and moved to Pomona, California at age 6. Pete graduated from Ganesha High School in 1968 and then attended and played collegiate baseball at Mt. San Antonio Jr. College for two years and Cal State Fullerton for two years. He graduated from Cal State Fullerton with a B.A. in mathematics and later received his Masters degree from the University of LaVerne. He began his teaching career in 1977 at Claremont High School and then began teaching at Bonita High School in La Verne, California. Pete coached varsity baseball at Bonita for seven years before moving to Gig Harbor in 1989.

Pete has coached boys and girls golf and girls bowling at Gig Harbor. Pete and his wife, Viv, have four children, Michele, Steve, Kaylee and Kevin. Kaylee is currently teaching 3rd grade in Bellingham and Kevin is starting his sophomore year at Pacific Lutheran University. Pete and Viv are also the proud grandparents of Kaylee's two one year old twin boys, Noah and Cole.



Pete has coached varsity baseball at Gig Harbor for 29 years. With the help of long time assistants, Larry Carlson and Larry Roehr, and many other outstanding assistant coaches the Tides baseball teams have amassed a record of 404 wins and 217 losses. Of course the main factor in the programs success has been all of the talented student-athletes that have contributed these past 29 years. Many of these ex- players are now coaching baseball at the high school and collegiate level. Tides baseball teams have been league champs seven times, competed in numerous state tournaments and won two state championships in 1997 and 2017.



Wyatt Tonkin, Shorewood

Coach Tonkin was Born in Seattle, Washington and attended O'Dea High School where he was a standout multisport athlete, lettering in baseball, football and basketball.

Wyatt was selected as an All-State baseball player 1972 and went on to attend Bellevue CC and the University of Washington, playing baseball for both schools.

He was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in June of 1976 and played 3 and 1/2 seasons in their minor league system.

Coach Tonkin began his coaching career with Kirkland Pepsi American Legion and began as the head baseball coach at Shorewood High School in 1999. Shorewood has amassed 8 WESCO titles, 5 regional championships and has made 8 state appearances with 5 final four finishes. They have finished second twice. Wyatt was fortunate to have several great assistant coaches at Shorewood, including his brother Bud.

Wyatt has spent 18 years as a coach of the T-Birds and was a major contributor to the success of the Thunderbird program recording 317 wins in that time. Coach Tonkin was married to his wonderful wife, Alice, for 33 years who passed away in 2017. He had the honor and privilege of coaching both of his sons, (Shea class of 2002, currently the head coach of Roosevelt HS) and Tyler, (class of 2004 who is currently serving his country as a Naval Aviator).


